

Belgian Beer

Brugse Zot Sportzot Alcohol Free (0.4%)

Sportzot is the first non-alcoholic speciality beer with the taste of Belgium. Fruity flavours that combine well with the bit sweet, but not too sweet, malty base.

De la Senne Taras Bulba(4.5%)

Generously hopped with the finest aromatic hops, giving it a very refreshing character and a scent reminiscent of citrus.

Stella Artois (GF) (4.6%)

A larger with hand-selected Saaz hops and high-quality malted barley combine to create a balance of crisp refreshment and aromatic flavour.

Westmalle Extra(4.8%)

A golden blond Trappist beer with its fruity notes and rich aromas, a very refreshing and thirst-quenching character.

Jupiler (5.2%)

A light with a dry finish. In 2015, it was awarded a Bronze Medal at the World Beer Awards for the category - Czech-Style Pale Lager.

St Bernardus WIT(5.5%)

A traditional wheat beer, zesty tastes of coriander and orange, with background touches of spicy cloves, fragrant with fruit and citrus.

Brugse Zot blonde (6.0%)

A medium bodied and well rounded, malty-hoppy, blond speciality Ale brewed in the medieval town of Bruges.

Orval Trappist(6.2%)

A medium bodied and unique, hoppy dry complex amber coloured Trappist Ale.







Boon Kriek (6.5%)

A cherry beer made by blending different ages of lambic and aging them again over real cherries.

Leffe blonde (6.6%)

Soft and creamy golden coloured beer with a discrete touch of bitterness and a light, sweet and caramelised taste.

Duvel (6.6%)

Duvel is a natural beer with a subtle bitterness, a refined flavour and a distinctive hop character.

Westmalle Double (7.0%)

A medium bodied and soothing, bitter-chocolaty, Dark Brown Trappist Ale.

Averbode blonde (7.5%)

A beautiful blond abbey ale with malty and light hoppy flavour.

Chouffe(8.0%)

A golden beer, with its light taste of hops.

Delirium Tremens (Gold in World Beer Awards) (8.5%)

A strong, delicious, spicy and warming Belgian ale.

Straffe Hendrik (9.0%)

A traditional top-fermentation beer that referments in the bottle a blond speciality Ale also brewed in the medieval town of Bruges.

Rochefort 8(9.2%)

A full bodied and well balanced, caramel bitter, dark Trappist Ale.

Westmalle Triple(9.5%)

A full bodied and intense, malty-hoppy, strong blond Trappist Ale.

St Bernardus ABT12(10%)

A traditional abbey ale, almost ebony in colour, smooth, creamy and full bodied with big richness of texture that is almost oily and very assertive, like a warming coconut brandy.

Straffe Hendrik Quadrupel II (11%)

a rich and intense dark Belgian ale. It is brewed with a subtle blend of specialty malts, which give the ale an extremely dark colour and a chewy, malty complex character.
